LEARNING SUPPORT UPDATE

Welcome back to school to all students, staff, and parents!

We have been busy planning and preparing for the amazing year ahead and cannot wait to share it with students. September is a busy month in the classroom and in the office so it is important that if parents have any questions that they contact us, either at the office or individual teachers directly.

In my role as Learning Support Teacher at BMC, I am tasked with outlining learning plans for students with unique learning needs, working with teachers as we explore how specific students learn best, and ensuring students have the supports in place that will enable them to more successfully meet learning goals in the classroom. This work is done in partnership with teachers, support staff, students and parents.

If your child has unique learning needs, you will hear from me in the first few weeks of school in order for us to better understand and accommodate for those needs. In some instances I may even ask you to come to the school to have a meeting with myself and other members of the BMC learning team, based on your child's areas of greatest need.

If your child is new to BMC and you are unsure if we are fully aware of specific needs they may have, you are invited to contact me via phone or email to discuss them. We often find that students entering our school in grade 7 need a bit of an adjustment period to get settled in and for teachers to really get to know them as individuals. Please be patient with us as we get to learn about your child and connect with them in the classroom.

It is our goal, each and every day, to engage students in learning we are passionate about, to ignite a student's own passion, and to connect with each student on a personal level. In July, we had a team of students head down to the Crowsnest Pass for the Sinister 7 Ultra Marathon and Relay. The Sinister 7 is a 100 mile (161 km) course that takes the runners through the most rugged, remote and beautiful terrain in Alberta's stunning Rocky Mountains. With 6, 400 m of elevation gain across the course, it is a challenge to say the least. The race is open to solo runners or teams of up to seven and racers have 30 hours to complete the grueling event. The course is split into seven stages, each featuring a geographic and historic highlight of the area. This year's team consisted of Cole Dooper, Hawkin Narkaus, Jay Hopfe, Brianna Patterson and BMC Alumni students, Brody Narkaus and Leah Reid. Finishing in a time of 23 hours, 58 minutes and 23 seconds, the team finished 98th out of 223 teams. Thank-you to the runners for killing it out there and their families for making the trip south!
