Updates for the parents of Buck Mountain Central School



Dear Parents & Guardians,

Just like that we are back to online learning. I cannot reiterate enough how appreciative I am of our student, parent, and staff's ability to adapt. Thank you! If you are anything like me, the past 14 months have been full of challenges. The uncertainty that surrounds so much of our lives is exhausting and I can appreciate all the different scenarios facing our families right now. I just want to take a moment to encourage each of you in the face of these challenges and remind you that we are here to support you and your child. Student engagement online has been great so far and I want to encourage everyone to maintain their routines, stay connected, and continue learning.

As a staff, we are still planning with the end in mind. Our provincial government is viewing this as a short circuit breaker and we will continue on with our in-class learning after the long weekend. That gives us 10 days of online teaching and then a sprint to the end of June to finish up our courses before final exams. Students are aware of the expectations of their teachers and need to be in constant contact with them, as they are available during regular school hours. The Meets students and teachers engage in is valuable class time that is required for success in their courses. Students can do this well over the next week-and-a-half. Our messaging from November/December remains the same for May. It is best if students maintain their routine, attend their classes virtually, stay connected to each other and their teachers, and continue learning. Again, we thank students, staff, and families for their dedicated support in keeping everyone safe, healthy, and engaged during this home stretch!

This time of year is normally split between managing the busyness of May with planning for the following school year. While the busyness of May feels different than normal, the planning for next year part of my day to day is bringing me optimism. Once again, BMC is growing! We are anticipating over 200 students next year.

Staff will engage in professional learning around addressing learning gaps in literacy and numeracy on our May 21 JEPD Day. We will continue to determine the best path forward in addressing these gaps, in addition to engaging in transition planning for next school year.

- Joining Ms. Erickson in a full-time capacity is Judy Miller. Mrs. Miller has spent many years at BMC and we are thrilled to have her share her expertise on a full-time basis.
- Julian Moore has accepted a transfer to PLRS and will be departing for there at the end of the school year. We are
 thrilled for Mr. Moore and wish him the best in his move. Morgan Rauser will also be returning to PLRS full time. We are
 grateful for Miss Rauser pushing BMC forward in the area of inclusive education. In addition, I will be joining the
 administrative team at WCHS.
- We are in the process of hiring another Math/Science teacher.

We communicated our graduation plans to our grade 12 class last week. Currently, we are working on our online ceremony while also working with our graduation committee and staff to creatively celebrate our graduates. More details about our plan will be released when we confirm them.

We celebrated Teacher Appreciation Week recently and I couldn't think of a better week to celebrate our staff at BMC. Over the past 14 months, teachers have shifted between in-person and online, connecting with students throughout. I hear daily from parents about the connection their student has with a teacher at BMC and it reminds me of the hard work they do each day. I am grateful for the tremendous staff we have at BMC every week, but especially this week.

EVERGREEN CO-OPERATIVE SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarships are created to assist the Evergreen Co-op staff members and their families, as well as Evergreen Co-op members, to further their education.

Scholarship Value:

Up to four scholarships of \$1,500.00 each, will be awarded to individuals throughout the Evergreen Co-op trading area. The number of recipients of the scholarships will be determined annually by the Scholarship Committee and Board of Directors.

Application Forms:

The Evergreen Co-op Scholarship application forms may be obtained from Evergreen Co-op Administration Offices in the Rimbey Shopping Centre and the Rocky Mountain House Shopping Centre locations, as well as online.

Application Process & Submission Date:

Applicants will need to submit a completed application and provide proof of acceptance and enrolment into the program which the scholarship is being applied for, prior to being awarded the Evergreen Co-op Scholarship.

A completed application form and all documentation must be returned to the Administration Office from which the application was received on/or before the close of business of the third Friday of August, or they can be emailed to: info@evergreen.crs

Eligibility:

Applicants must be one of the following:

- 1. An Evergreen Co-op staff member and/or immediate family members.
- 2. Members of the Evergreen Co-op and/or immediate familymembers.

Applicants must indicate their Co-op involvement as well as their involvement in sports, community activities, volunteer activities, type and length of program entered, approximate annual cost of program and any other information deemed important.

Applicants must complete an application form and provide a minimum of two letters of reference from a teacher, employer, minister or coach. Must include at least one Community and one Educational reference letter.

Selection Process:

The Scholarship Committee of the Evergreen Board of Directors will review the applications received and present its recommendations to the Board of Directors at the September Board Meeting for the final decision.

In making its decision on the successful applicants the Committee will consider the following items:

- 1. Co-op experience;
- 2. Financial need;
- 3. Community involvement (volunteer work, groups, etc.);
- 4. Work experience;
- 5. Program to be studied and cost of the program being studied;

All applicants will be notified, regardless of the outcome of their application, shortly following the September Board meeting.

The Committee may arrange an official presentation of the Awards at which time photos will be taken so that the Co-op can announce publicly the winners.

If the successful applicant is a graduating student(s), the scholarship winners may be recognized at a function at the student's school.



Notes about PowerSchool

Students and families are encouraged to continue to access their attendance and achievement information in PowerSchool. If you need assistance in accessing your account, or creating one, please contact the office and our administrative assistants will support you. Students already have an account set up under their student number and password used for accessing their regular school account -- it is the same information used to log into a desktop computer at the school.

Please notice that if you are using the application on your cell phone, there are notification settings that are helpful to get real-time updates. During this session of learning at home, please note that attendance information is verified at the office at 3:30 each day. If you receive a notification that does seem right, you're welcome to contact the office, however we will take a bit more time verifying absences than if students were in the building. Thank you for your patience and understanding with this.

Another tool we will be using in PowerSchool this year is student course requests to create student class schedules for next year. This will be done right in this application instead of through Google Forms as we have done in the past. Each class will be taken through the process, however parents and guardians will also have access to see the requests students have made and to make changes as necessary. All course selections and requests must be complete by June 22nd, 2021.

WRPS BYOD

WRPS is pleased to announce our adoption of a BYOD - Bring Your Own Device program to our schools. Students are encouraged to bring their own chromebook to school each day. This is an optional program and our school staff are working through some details to make this happen in our school. WRPS has partnered with Staples in Camrose and Leduc as one option for purchasing a chromebook and they can offer 6 or 12 month payment plans with zero interest.
